To reach a staff member or if a pastoral concern arises, contact the church office or note who is out of the office and email one of the pastors directly and we will respond in a timely manner.


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

This morning's prelude is based on the 17th Century English melody, "Royal Oak." Leading us into worship on this first Sunday in spring, this light and happy tune is playfully parried back and forth between the organ and piano. The full text of today's offertory can be found as #250 in our hymnal. It is frequently titled, "Hymn of Promise" and is often recognized by its opening lines: "In the bulb there is a flower, in the seed, an apple tree, in cocoons, a hidden promise: butterflies will soon be free! In the cold and snow of winter there's a spring that waits to be, unrevealed until its season, something God alone can see." The opening notes of this arrangement may suggest the earliest spring crocus, seeming to appear from nowhere. From there, the timbre of the music closely follows the sentiment and poetry of Mrs. Sleeth's moving text, leading us forward to Easter.
