INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

This morning's prelude was written 150 years ago by the daughter of an Anglican priest, yet it has a very Calvinist perspective. It is a ubiquitous hymn found in over 1150 hymnals across most denominations. Many consider it one of the greatest hymns of dedication ever written as it offers: my life, my hands, my voice, my money, my will, and my love. It is #697 in our hymnal. The simplicity of the text can stand alone as prayer, or as instruction as we teach children to live generous lives. "Be Thou My Vision" is just a little over one hundred years old, yet it feels ageless. It wasn't until 1919 that the translation of a 6th century Irish poem was combined with the ancient melody, "Slane." Bethany K. Smith's arrangement frames the familiar folk tune with drama and flair making it seem even more Celtic.
