# **INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS**


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

# **NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC**

This morning's prelude dates from the early years of the Protestant Reformation and was authored by the great reformer, Martin Luther. The text is based on the opening lines of Psalm 46, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." On this Reformation Sunday, it is very fitting that the organ and piano together lead us into worship with this "Battle Hymn of the Reformation." As the service concludes, all voices join, sending us forth with this same powerful hymn. The offertory, in contrast to the boldness of the prelude and closing hymn, is quiet and introspective – at first. The reflective opening develops from a prayer of surrender to an affirmation and celebration of acceptance.
