INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

This morning's patriotic music is very traditional. It begins with our National March and continues with our National Anthem. It is appropriate to remain seated when this anthem is played in a concert setting as it is today. Feel free to sing along with "God Bless America," a prayer for our nation. Our National Hymn, "God of Our Fathers" leads us into worship. The offertory can be traced back to 1845. The lullaby-like melody, repetition, and simplicity of the text made it accessible for congregations where printed hymnals were not affordable. Like many spirituals, the verses could be created on the spot for the situation. The traditional opening verse is: "In the morning when I rise, In the morning when I rise, Give me Jesus. Give me Jesus. Give me Jesus."
