

Some of the items available that evening will be Clown Cones, Ice Cream Pie, Chocolate Sundae, Root beer Float, or a simple dish of ice cream. You will not even need to get out of your vehicle! You can make your selections at your first stop, then loop around to the pick-up stop and your goodies will be brought to your vehicle window. The Ice Cream Drive Thru will be open 6:30-8:00 pm on August 16. There is no cost, but donations are accepted.

- 9:00 am Livestreamed Full Worship Service (only Worship Team present)
 - ✓ Our current livestreamed worship will be available to you at 9:00 am or any time after
 - ✓ This is the service that the congregational surveys overwhelmingly indicated must be our priority and must continue as is.
- 11:00 am In-Person Worship (limited to 75 people)
 - √ 45-minute service with restrictions for all worshipers
 - ✓ Minimum 6' social distancing at all times inside the building
 - ✓ No social interaction inside the building
 - ✓ Wearing face masks mandatory for entrance to the building and must always be worn in the building; if you do not wear a face mask, you will be asked to go home and livestream.
 - ✓ No congregational singing or spoken responses
 - ✓ Advanced registration and reserved seating required for worship EACH WEEK through phone call or Sign-Up Genius. Please call Rebekah Witt at 540-686-0752 for phone reservations on Monday or Tuesday. The Sign-Up Genius link will be emailed by the church office on Tuesday afternoons. You will need to register again every week.
 - ✓ Limited seating capacity in Sanctuary (75)
 - ✓ Printed bulletins on pews
 - ✓ Restrooms available one person at a time
 - ✓ No Nursery provided.
 - ✓ We would strongly encourage those who are most compromised and those who are not able to adhere to the restrictions to stay home, stay safe, and worship with us through livestream.
